



Collision Reconstruction – What Could Possibly Go Wrong?

Ever crunch numbers in your reconstruction reports till your eyes hurt? Was the defendant driver really doing 647 mph or could it possibly be 64.7 mph? Does your accident reconstruction defy the Laws of Physics? Can a tractor-trailer perform better than a Formula 1 race car?
